REP1 Prepare a Fire Protection Certification Statement or Report (QLD344REP1A)

COURSE OVERVIEW

This course covers the procedures and industry issues for the preparation of a statement or report used for certifying the installation or maintenance of a fire protection system or equipment in a building.

WHY CHOOSE THIS COURSE?

The Post Trade Qualification—REP1, Prepare a Fire Protection Certification Statement or Report is intended to provide participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to prepare a fire protection certification statement or report. The Statement of Attainment is recognised by the Queensland Building and Construction Commission (QBCC). The licence class Certify, Install and Maintain Passive Fire Protection—Fire Collars, Penetrations and Joint Sealing is achieved by completing REP1 along with the Certificate II in Fire Protection Inspection & Testing. Information regarding Occupational Licencing is available from the QBCC at www.qbcc.qld.gov.au.

WHEN AND WHERE?

The unit is delivered via distance education in a self-paced mode with tutorials and workshops offered at regular intervals depending upon demand.

HOW MUCH TIME WILL I NEED TO COMMIT

As a guide only, you should set aside between six to twelve months to complete this course. The timeframe will also be influenced by your experience and current workload.

HOW MUCH WILL IT BE?

The fee for the course will be \$710,

Upon completion of all requirements, you will receive your Statement of attainment.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The certify licence class for Fire Occupational Licencing is generally for people who operate at a higher level than the install and maintain licence class. The following is a prerequisite for this course—

- White card i.e. CPCCOHS1001A Work Safely in the Construction Industry

It is recommended that participants also have:

- At Least two (2) years experience in the industry and access to a suitable workplace to undertake the assignment and research tasks
- An intermediate level of numeracy, literacy and computer skills.

ASSESSMENT

The unit requires the completion of three (3) research activities and a workplace based project in the preparation of fire safety system compliance certification statements or reports.

OUTCOMES:

Successful completion of this course will provide the participants with a Statement of Attainment in REP1—Prepare a Fire Protection Certification Statement or Report (QLD344REP1).
